1 Choose

2 Apply

Armed with your list of preferences, you can now apply to study at Adelaide University through the SATAC website. If you need help with your application, contact our Future Student Enquiries team for support.

☆ TIP

Remember to list your preferences in order of what you're most passionate about, not based on your ATAR. How you list your preferences is how SATAC will provide offers (by working down the list).

In your SATAC application, make sure you use your own mobile number and a personal email address – one you can access after high school.

And, don't forget to apply before the early application deadline to avoid a late fee.

5 Check and confirm

Year 12 SACE results are finalised in mid-December. Check to see if you're eligible for adjustment factors (bonus points) and confirm your Selection Rank (ATAR, including adjustment factors), by visiting SATAC's self-service portal. Then, give our Future Student Enquiries team a call to talk through your study options.

You could be eligible for Guaranteed Entry into your preferred degree (see page 1).

It's also important to confirm your preferences by the change of preference deadline to be considered for an offer.

☆TIP

Remember to pay your SATAC application fee. If you don't, you won't be eligible to receive an offer.

Offers to Year 12 students will begin in January, and continue to be made until late February.

If you do receive an offer, read your SATAC email carefully for important information about responding to your offer and the program enrolment process. For non-school applicants, offers will start in September.
