What is the New Colombo Plan (NCP) Scholarship?

Opportunity for Australian undergraduate students to strengthen their Indo-Pacific capability and Asian literacy, including in Asian language learning, through immersive, long-term structured learning and internships in the region, in areas of Australia's strategic and economic interests.

Including in priority host locations, languages and sectors.





2026 New Colombo Plan Overview

- 3 to 19 months in the Indo-Pacific for study and language training and internship
- For Australian undergraduate students
- Up to \$107,000 in funding available to scholars
- Applicants must be nominated by Adelaide University
- Study commences between 1 January 2026 and 31 December 2026

Tips for your applications

- 3. There is no "formula" for a perfect program design something that excites you and let that passion shine

Application Tips

- Review the selection criteria
 Check the NCP website and Advice to Applicants, then build your application around these points.
- Research your host destination
 Know exactly what you want to do there and why it matters to you I chose Japan for its highly innovative technology sector.
- Draft and get help
 Refining your answers multiple times and seeking feedback makes them concise, error-free, and confident.
- Use the STAR method Situation, Task, Action, Result — give clear, impactful examples drawn from your university and work experience.

2026 Scholarship Allowances

Activity	Maximum amount of expenses payable
Travel allowance	\$3,000 (one-off payment)
Establishment allowance	\$3,000 (one-off payment)
Scholarship allowance	Up to \$3,000 as a monthly stipend
Study component (max 2 semesters)	Up to \$15,000 per semester
In-country language training	Up to \$10,000
Mental health allowance	Up to \$3,000 reimbursed to scholar to contribute to the cost of professional mental health services
Plus:	Health and travel insurance, a case manager, advice and assistance

Eligibility

Read the full 2026 NCP Scholarship Guidelines

An applicant must:

- ✓ Be an Australian citizen
- ✓Not be a current citizen or permanent resident of their proposed host location(s)
- ✓ Admitted in an Australian undergraduate degree program for which you will receive full academic credit for the study component of their NCP scholarship program
- ✓ Have mandatory units to enrol and undertake in that home degree program after they return to Australia following the end of their NCP scholarship program



Eligibility (cont.)

- ✓ Be between 18 and 30 years of age (inclusive) for non-Indigenous applicants, or between 18 and 35 years of age (inclusive) for Indigenous applicants, on 1 January 2026
- ✓ GPA of 5.5 or above
- ✓ Not be an employee of the branch of DFAT or the contractor that administers the NCP
- ✓ Be nominated by your home university



Selection Criteria (1)

Alignment of application with the Government's geographic and sectoral priorities in the Indo-Pacific region (35%)

- Describe how your scholarship program aligns with and will contribute to Australian Government priorities, demonstrating a well-researched, cohesive scholarship program that provides an immersive experience, and
- Describing the linkages (personal and institutional) that you will develop while undertaking your NCP Scholarship, building on your demonstrated interest in, and knowledge of, the Indo-Pacific.



Selection Criteria (2)

Focus on Indo-Pacific languages, especially priority languages (15%)

- Describe how you will incorporate the study of an Indo-Pacific language, especially a priority Asian language, into your NCP Scholarship Program and the level of capability you aim to achieve, and
- Outline how you will use and maintain the language proficiency obtained during your NCP Scholarship in your future studies, work or community engagement.



Selection Criteria (3)

Personal attributes for successful completion of scholarship (30%)

- Describe any challenges and risks you might face in your host location and how you would respond to them
 – for example academic, cultural, personal –
 demonstrating a well-researched host location, and
- Describe why you consider you having the attributes that will enable you to deal with these challenges and risks.





Selection Criteria (4)

Future impact of NCP experiences focussed with regards to maintaining engagement with the Indo-Pacific (20%)

- Describe how you plan to use your NCP experience after you have completed your scholarship, demonstrating a long-term forward plan, and
- Describe how you scholarship experience will establish your Indo Pacific-links and your plan for maintaining those links.



2026 NCP Scholarship Applications

Expression of Interest

- What should you write about for your program of study
 - ✓ What country you want to go to
 - ✓ If you intend to do the language stream
 - ✓ How long for and when
 - ✓ What type of internship and with who
 - ✓ How does your NCP program align with your career and study goals

Remember:

- Your program of study does not need to be concrete when you submit your EOI, but should be pretty close to it. You will need to have your program plan finalised before submitting your application to DFAT.
- We want to hear your ideas about your program of study, and can offer advice or suggestions



Expression of Interest (cont.)

- Selecting a host country
 - ✓ Diversity
 - ✓ Interest
 - √ Suitability

- Selecting a host university
 - > Exchange partner vs non-exchange partner
 - > Available courses
 - > Exchange Application Dates: December for Semester 2 2026





Priority Host Locations: India, Indonesia, Vietnam, Timor-Leste

Highly Favourable Host Locations: China, Fiji, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand

Priority Asian Languages: Bahasa Indonesian, Malay, Chinese (Mandarin), Hindi, Japanese, Korean, Vietnamese

Priority Sectors: Economics and Business, Environment,
Primary Industries and Natural Resources, Infrastructure,
Climate and Energy, Law, Asian Studies, Culture and Human
Development, Technology and Innovation.



How to Apply

- 11.59pm (ACST) on 24 August 2025: Submit an online application for internal nomination. Address the four selection criteria and outline your proposed program. Not as many requirements as the external application
- 2. Internal selection committee selects nominees
- 3. Late Aug: Adelaide University nominees announced
- 4. Late Aug/Early Sep: Nominees formally invited to apply by the Australian Government.



How to Apply (cont.)

- 5. 11:30pm (AEST) 23 September 2025: Final application deadline to the Australian Government.
- 6. Government selection:

Oct: Shortlisting

Oct-Nov: Interviews

Dec: Candidates informed of outcome

Dec: Public announcement



Final Application Documents

The following are required if you are nominated by the Adelaide and are invited to apply by the Australian Government:

- Written responses to selection criteria
- Outline of proposed scholarship program including the mandatory study component, any proposed internships and language training
- Nominate a primary host location



Final Application Documents (cont.)

- Evidence of Australian citizenship (e.g. current Australian passport biopage or Australian citizenship certificate)
- A letter of current enrolment from Adelaide University, including the expected completion date for the course towards which the overseas study program will be credited
- A current, complete-to-date official academic transcript from the University of Adelaide or University of South Australia
- Evidence of affiliation with the proposed host institution if applicable – Global Learning can help with this if applying to an exchange partner university



Final Application Documents (cont.)

- A letter from the applicant's home university faculty, endorsed by the NCP International Liaison Officer for Scholarships, attesting the feasibility of the applicant's proposed study component
- A current CV outlining the applicant's work experience, community engagement activities (for example, volunteering, memberships, mentoring) and extra-curricular interests
- Two referee reports, with at least one report from an academic referee
- Photo identification
